



Everyone should have access to great movies. To support this, AMC associates must always ingest content that has all three types of assisted moviegoing whenever possible. Most Digital Cinema Packages (DCPs) include assisted moviegoing content; however, the labels vary slightly from film distributor to distributor. Use this job aid to select the content containing all of the assistive moviegoing amenities.

PROCEDURES

Use the following steps, and the color-coded example of a standard DCP label below, to determine the assisted moviegoing offerings in each feature DCP to ingest appropriately.

Standard DCP Label (Example)

1. **Closed Captioning** - Check the DCP for closed captioning content. Features with closed captions will usually have “CC” or “CCAP” somewhere in the DCP name, usually in the language section (orange portion above).

2. **Open Captioning** - Check the DCP for open captioning content. Features with open captions will usually have “OC” or “OCAP” somewhere in the DCP name, usually in the language section (orange portion above).

3. **Visually Impaired Content** - Check the DCP for visually impaired content. Features with visually impaired content (i.e., descriptive narration service) typically have “VI” or “VIN” somewhere in the DCP name, usually in the audio section (teal portion above).

4. **Hearing Impaired Content** - Check the DCP for hearing impaired content. Features with hearing impaired content (i.e., assistive listening) typically have “HI” somewhere in the DCP name, usually in the audio section (teal portion above)

5. **Verify** the audio track channel (1 or 2) can be heard after ingesting the content with each assistive moviegoing amenityⁱ.
6. **Verify** the open captions are properly being displayed on screen (i.e., captions are not cropped, or overlapping each other).
